One night, after a screening of *Zombieland 2*, he hopped into his car to go home. That's when trouble struck. Josh turned down a backroad only to see a deer charging directly at his vehicle. He tried to pump the brakes, but by the time he realized what was going on it was already too late.

"It was terrifying. It was literally horrific. I put my car in park and tried to chase down this deer. I couldn't find it. I went in a field of cattails to see if I killed the thing."

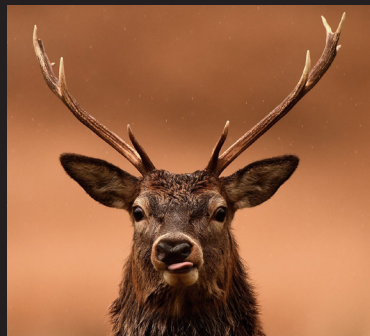
