Josh was back home in Pittsburgh during fall break, visiting friends and preparing for upcoming academic responsibilities. One night, after a screening of Zombieland 2, he hopped into his car to go home. That's when trouble struck. Josh turned down a backroad only to see a deer charging directly at his vehicle. He tried to pump the brakes, but by the time he realized what was going on it was already too late.

"It was terrifying. It was literally horrific. I put my car in park and tried to chase down this deer. I couldn't find it. I went in a field of cattails to see if I killed the thing."

Josh was not in a good state during this interview. Although the incident was weeks ago, the trauma had clearly taken its toll. He was unable to complete a single sentence without stuttering or breaking into tears.
