## CHANGES COMING TO HOUSING FOR THE 2020-2021 ACADEMIC YEAR

There are many rumors going around about changes to housing for next year. The rumors I have heard ranged from Shorney becoming quiet housing (lol) to East Quad being substance free (again, lol). With so much confusion and rumors abound its important to get the facts. Below are all of the real changes coming to housing next year:

- Silverstein Hall will open and have 4-person apartments with single bedrooms. The floor plans for Silberstein are on our MyDenison site that can be viewed right now.
- Shorney, Smith and Crawford Halls will house first-year students (Class of 2024) and will be renovated over the summer.
- Curtis East and Curtis West will be combined into just Curtis Hall. The hall will be designated for upperclassmen and will be renovated over the summer. Renovations include new flooring, lighting, paint and furniture as well as upgraded lounges. More single rooms will be added along with other layout changes to the building. Plan can be viewed on MyDenison.
- Myers Hall will receive the same renovation Pratt and Brown Halls received in previous years including new flooring, lighting, paint and furniture.
- Shaw Hall will house students who are participating in Off-Campus Study. If studying away during Spring 2021, students will live in Shaw for fall semester. If studying away during Fall 2020, students will live in Shaw for spring semester. This change comes from feedback Off Campus Study received from prior students than went abroad that wanted more support.
- Next semester, King Hall will undergo a complete overhaul of the building. After the renovation, King will have more standard room layouts as well as opening up the skylight in the building.
- Laundry fees will be included in student room costs. All laundry machines will be new in Fall 2020 and students will have access to a laundry monitoring mobile app to view machine availability, alerts when laundry is done and submit service requests. This new system is more sustainable as well, as people will not be shoving everything they have into the machines.
