A CONCISE SUMMARY OF DENISON'S RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS

Students have been asked to vacate Denison's campus by March 16 and bring all of their belongings with them, if possible.

This decision comes after three cases of COVID-19 were confirmed in the Cleveland area (as of Tuesday, March 10). Governor Mike DeWine declared a state of emergency and advised Ohio colleges to cease face-to-face classes.

After much anticipation as to how Denison would respond to the novel coronavirus, college president Adam Weinberg sent an email to students and faculty last night.

Students were instructed not to return until April 3 at the earliest; this will require students to leave campus for three weeks instead of one. With the possibility of remote learning until the end of the semester, Weinberg urged students to bring all of their belongings with them.

Regardless of whether Denison opts to return to normal classes after April 3, remote classes will begin on March 23. Beginning next week, professors will be trained in teaching online courses.

Students were initially required to move out by this Saturday, March 14, by 9 a.m. at the latest. In light of requesting students leave with most of their personal belongings, however, this deadline has been extended to Monday, March 16.

The decision to extend spring break and instigate remote classes is in line with many other Ohio colleges, but canceling the remainder of the semester after this three-week hiatus is still a looming possibility.
