MY EVIDENCE THAT ONE DIRECTION ARE GETTING BACK TOGETHER IN 2020

As we might all recall, in January of 2016 the boyband One Direction officially went on 'hiatus.' At the time, this break was only meant to last a few months before the band would reunite. Obviously, it has now been four years since the beginning of the hiatus. While other bands have gone on longer hiatuses and gotten back together, Fall Out Boy and My Chemical Romance come to mind, for a long time it seemed that One Direction was done for good. But, 2020 marks the 10th anniversary since One Direction's members were put together as a band on *The X Factor UK*, making many fans hopeful that this big anniversary could create the perfect set up for the long awaited reunion. Here is a compiled list of all the evidence that, to me (a longtime fan), seems to suggest that this year is the year of One Direction's return:

1. Last week, One Direction's official Twitter account re-followed former band member Zayn Malik, who split from the group in 2015 to pursue a solo R&B-styled career. The announcement of Zayn's departure from the group was also deleted from the band's official Facebook page.
2. The official Twitter accounts of both Sirius XM radio and Capital radio have been tweeting very suspicious things, and mentioning both each member's solo careers and the band much more frequently in the past few weeks. When questioned by fans whether they were joking about a 1D reunion the Sirius XM account responded "We 100 percent can say we're not." (Feb 5th, 2020)
3. While Louis, Harry, and Niall are all embarking on large world tours this year for each of their respective albums, each of their solo tours end long before the end of 2020. Similarly, if you Google One Direction events, it appears that there is one concert listed under One Direction for December 31st, 2020 in Australia. While this could simply be a computer error, it is interesting to add nonetheless.

Another interesting thing to note about the Summer 2020 solo tours is that the official final date of Louis' tour is July 23rd in Vancouver, a date which corresponds with the official 10th anniversary of One Direction's formation. Some fans have suggested that this concert could be a secret or surprise reunion event, but these claims have no official backing beyond the coincidence of the date.

4. At the beginning of January, the band’s official website updated for the first time since the hiatus in 2016. Nothing major appeared to change, except for the date at the bottom of the page now lists 2020 rather than 2016. The webpage still says “We’ll be back soon.”

5. In an interview in January promoting his first solo project since the hiatus, Liam let slip that there is some sort of 10th anniversary project in the works. When asked for details about a specific concert from the Made in the A.M. Tour, Liam apparently said: “I think we filmed that show and it will be part of a documentary around an anniversary.”
