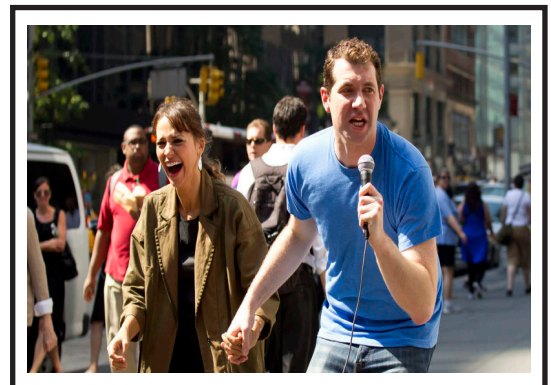
**These are all pretty mainstream, recently popular shows. Sorry-I'm basic.*

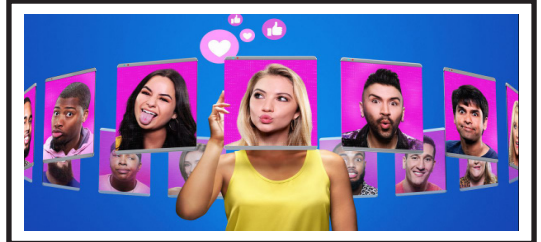
