THAT'S SOOO COOL THAT DCGA HAS \$

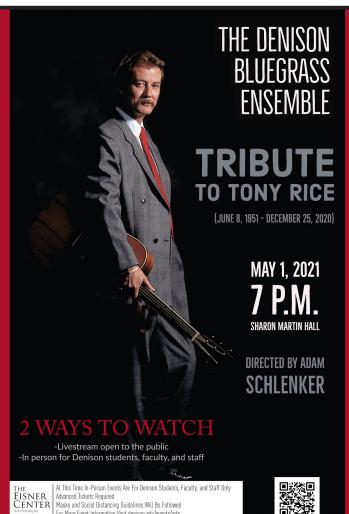

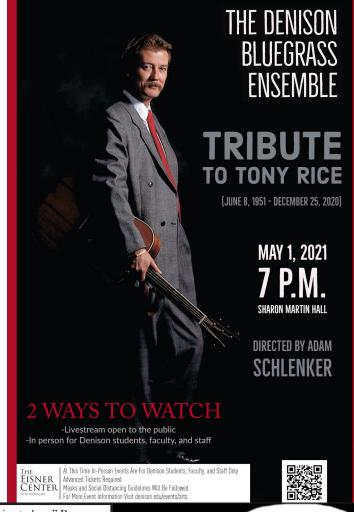
