Dear campus community,

I am honored to be surrounded by such upstanding citizens.

I wanted to address some concerns we've had in regards to gatherings on East Quad. We are anticipating warmer weather in the coming weeks, and with warmer weather comes expanded outdoor activities. Although we are working towards full campus vaccination, we still cannot allow the outdoor gatherings we saw last semester. I have been in talks with student leaders and our biology department, and we have come to the conclusion on some preventative measures.

For the past month, the dedicated students and faculty of our biology department have been working tirelessly to genetically modify chihuahuas generously donated to us by the Licking County Humane Society.
