So what's the theory? Well fasten your brain because I'm about to blow your mind. Einstein isn't a real person.

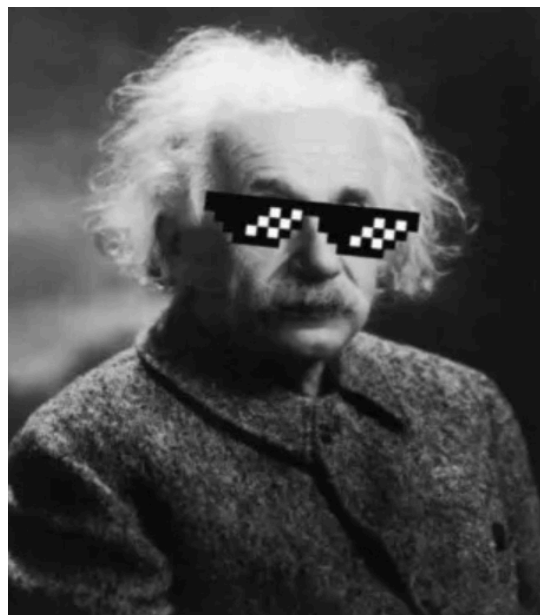
